

# Town committee approves community grants

The Town of Halton Hills Community Affairs Committee approved municipal grants to a number of local groups. The Acton Seniors Centre received a \$208 waiver of town fees for its spring walk-a-thon and the Acton Agricultural Society received \$5,387 for its fall fair marketing, delivery of town equipment

and waiver of Town fees. The Acton Fire Fighters Association received \$695 for the waiving of facility fees and marketing and promotion (Canada Day fireworks) and the Glen Williams Town Hall Board received \$1,757 for its Canada Day celebrations that included the waiving of facility fees, marketing and promo-

tion and the loan of Town equipment. Requests for municipal assistance were denied to the Lions Club of Georgetown for \$232 for the waiver of fees and to the Halton Hills Chapter of the Toronto Bruce Trail Club for \$1,000 for the design and printing of a hiking trail brochure.

## NOTICE OF COMPLETION

### Sanitary Sewer Main and Sewerage Forcemain in Future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. from Approximately 420 metres East of Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) to Regional Road 25, Town of Milton Class Environmental Assessment

To allow for the wastewater (sanitary sewage) servicing of Sherwood Survey Secondary Plan lands and future Milton Phase 3 lands, the Halton Region is proposing to construct a sanitary sewer and sewerage forcemain in future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. from approximately 420 metres East of Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) to Regional Road 25. Subject to the necessary approvals, the project is planned to be completed in the spring of 2007.

The above project is being planned under **Schedule B** of the **Municipal Class Environmental Assessment**. Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Halton Region intends to proceed with the design and construction of this project.

Interested parties should provide written comments to Halton on the proposal within 30 calendar days from the date of this notice. Comments should be directed to Mr. Laird Smith as noted below.

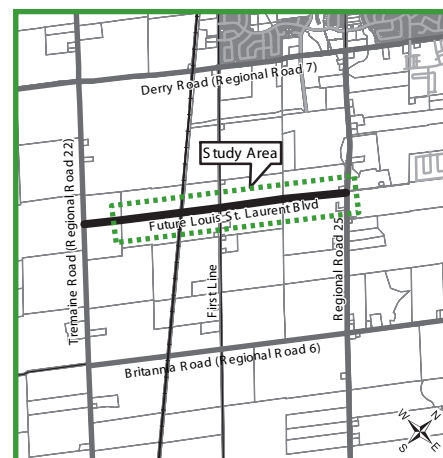
If concerns arise regarding this project which cannot be resolved in discussion with Halton, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environment assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this notice. A copy of this request must also be sent to the Halton Region. If there is no request received by October 24, 2006, the Sanitary Sewer Main and Sewerage Forcemain in Future Louis St. Laurent Blvd. will proceed to design and construction as presented in the planning documentation.
