Eric Langen plays the paranoid Gordon, who is hiding in the basement, away from all 'those people who are talking about him in the mall,' after his wife left him for a bush pilot. Langen's performance is also solid, giving Gordon a 'troubled' persona that doesn't quite have a real grip on many aspects of the world in general.

Sheri Beker has the job of providing most of the laughs as she plays the neurotic daughter Stacey. Beker's portrayal of the spastic crazed woman (with the hair to match) never ceases to make the audience burst into laughter, particularly during her frenetic outbursts.

The set of *Some Assembly Required* is unique, incorporating three different rooms on three different levels, as the action moves seamlessly from one room to the next. It's a clever portrayal of three different levels in one house.

Lighting works well too, as the action

switches from one floor to the next. Even Mother's bedroom, which is essentially in darkness, has effective lighting to give the audience a sense of a dark bedroom.

Some Assembly Required is not an easy play to watch. The dialogue, although humorous, has moments that can actually cause one to want to scream at the protagonists, and tell them to grow up.

At times, *Some Assembly Required* gives one a feeling of the movie *National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation*, as the plot seems to prey on every foible of the Christmas season.

Some Assembly Required is a funny play, and does entertain. Act One tends to move a bit slowly but the audience is rewarded for their patience when the curtains open on Act Two.

The play continues its run this week.
