The Ontario Power Authority (OPA) has awarded TransCanada Corporation a contract to own and operate a 683 megawatt (MW) natural gas-fired generating facility in the Town of Halton Hills, Ontario. The facility will have the capacity to generate enough power for approximately 600,000 homes. The Halton Hills Generating Station (HHGS) is anticipated to be in service by the summer of 2010.

TransCanada has been an active participant in the Ontario power market for more than 15 years and we are committed to the Ontario power business for the long-term.

The HHGS will be located on undeveloped industrial lands in the 401 industrial corridor between Highway 401 and Steeles Avenue west of 6th Line. The generating facility will use state-of-the-art low emissions technology and be built to meet or exceed Ontario Ministry of the Environment standards.
