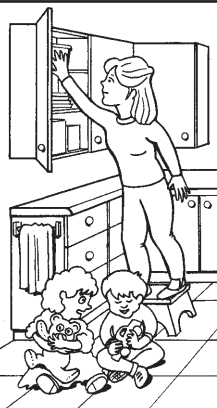


Christmas Carol performed Dec. 9

Acton High School Athletes of the Week are Emma Jolly and Brad Ethier. A Grade 10 student, Jolly co-coached the Bearcats' junior boys' volleyball team that showed steady improvement through the season. Ethier plays the Libero position for Acton's senior boys, who are in Dryden this weekend for the OFSAA AA volleyball championships.

Georgetown District High School Athletes of the Week are Brad Richards and Spencer Troop. Richards is the middle hitter on the senior Rebel volleyball squad that qualified as the eighth seed for this week's OFSAA AAAA tournament in Barrie. Troop came back from a knee injury early in the season to bolster Georgetown's linebacking core and make it to the Rebels' first appearance in the Halton football final in 30 years.
