



## Food drive for Bread Basket

## A treasure from Halton's past

The Halton Museum Foundation, initiated in 1998, is focussed on raising funds for phase two of renovations that will provide on-site storage for Halton's entire collection of more than 34,000 artifacts. It has recently acquired the copyright to the original 1877 Halton Historical Atlas and reproduced 500 copies, creating the only issue to date that is completely faithful to the original. The atlas provides a fascinating record of life in Halton County in the mid-1870s, including portraits and biographical sketches, as well as richly coloured maps and plans.
