Erin McGeachy (8th in Introductory Ladies A Freeskate); Madison Kelly (5th in Introductory Ladies B Freeskate).

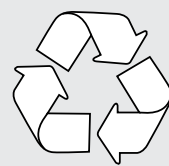
# Egg Nog Jog goes Sunday

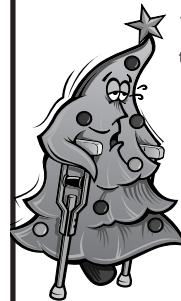
There will also be a "One Mile Smile" race for kids with a \$2 entry fee.

The sight and smell of a fresh Christmas tree can do wonders for the holiday spirit. However, natural trees should be handled with care to protect against the risk of fire. Follow these simple safety measures to keep your tree and home safe:

Choose a tree that is very green and does not lose needles when you tap it on the ground.

Cut 1"-2" off the trunk for optimal water absorption and place the tree in a clean, sturdy stand with water.

Check the water level of the tree stand every day.

Keep the tree away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources.

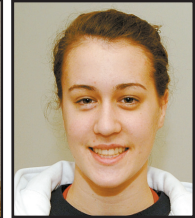

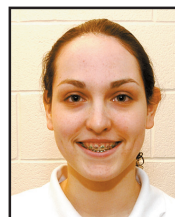
