NOTICE TO ALL CITIZENS OF HALTON REGION HALTON REGIONAL POLICE SERVICES BOARD

The Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton is seeking one citizen-at-large to represent it on the Halton Regional Police Services Board for a four year term. The Halton Regional Services Board is responsible for the provision of adequate and effective police services in Halton. The Board must also satisfy itself that the standards issued by the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services are upheld. Involvement in the day-to-day operating decisions of the police service is prohibited.

The Board meets a minimum of 12 times a year, on the 4th Thursday of each month, all day, commencing at 9:00 a.m. Meetings are held in the Halton Regional Police Services Headquarters building, or may be held on a rotational basis throughout the Region. Applicants must be willing to commit a minimum of twenty hours per month for Board business; however, this can increase dramatically if members are involved in collective bargaining. Board members are also required to attend evening and week-end functions to represent the Police Services Board.

All applicants will be required to apply for and obtain a security clearance at the Police Services Records Bureau.
