
Dunlop charity bonspiel raised \$3,000 for groups

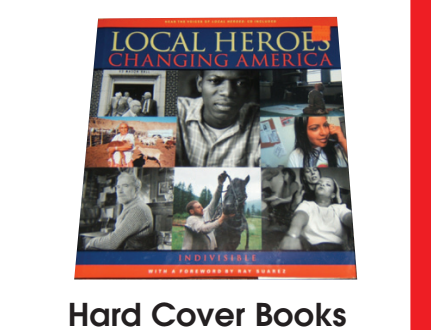
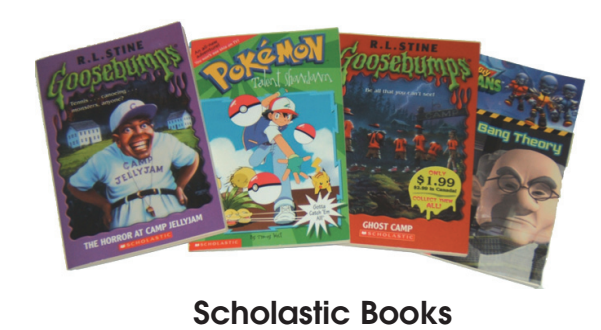
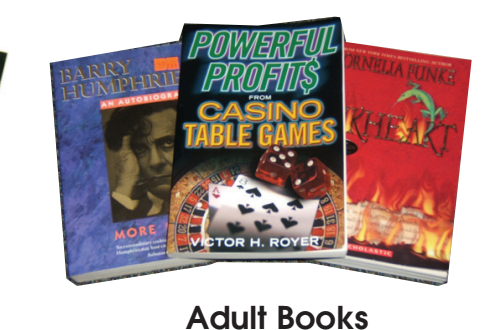
