NOTICE TO ALL CITIZENS OF HALTON REGION HALTON REGIONAL POLICE SERVICES BOARD

The Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton is seeking one citizen-at-large to represent it on the Halton Regional Police Services Board for a four year term.
