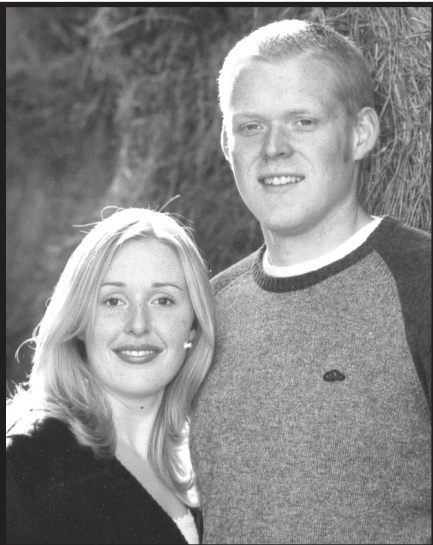

### IMMEDIATE DENTURES

An "Immediate Denture" is a denture that is inserted immediately following the extraction of the natural teeth.

Using this method, the denture actually acts as a sort of bandage to help the tissues heal. The denture must be left in place during the first 24 hours. You must follow normal post extraction recommendations, from your doctor and then come in for an adjustment/check-up appointment the following day. Another advantage, is that the patient gets their denture right away and doesn't have the inconvenience or embarrassment of having to go without teeth. Immediate dentures are very popular, however this route is not ideal for everyone. It often involves an extensive period of adjustment in which the patient and Denturist must work closely together for some time for best results.

If you have never worn dentures, your new teeth will probably feel strange and bulky in your mouth. This is because the muscles of your face, lip, cheeks, and tongue are used to your former teeth, or to nothing at all. These muscles are being stretched and molded to new contours and dimensions. This muscle tension will subside in a short period of time. Also, learning to chew properly with new dentures may take two to six weeks.

It is also important that the person who extracts your teeth, does not have to be the person who makes your denture. Denturist are "denture specialists" who work together with other dental professionals, to make sure you get the best denture care available.

## Pair arrested for bank holdups

A man and woman from Georgetown are facing charges in connection with four recent bank robberies and a gas station robbery in Peel Region.

Peel Police report a man wearing a mask entered the Shell gas station on Hurontario St. in Brampton holding a plastic garbage bin at 4:15 a.m. Dec. 23.

The man struck the cashier several times in the head with a sharp object and took a laptop computer, cash, cell phone and lottery tickets then fled to a waiting Dodge Shadow that had been reported stolen by Halton Police. The vehicle was later recovered at the Georgetown GO lot. The cashier required surgery for the head injury.

At approximately 3:50 p.m. Jan. 2 police report a woman went into the Bank of Montreal on Sandalwood Parkway in Brampton and passed a note to a teller demanding money. She fled with cash.

On Jan. 17 a man went into the Bank of Montreal on Goreway Dr. in

Mississauga and passed a note to a teller demanding money. He left with cash.

On Jan. 19 at 12:05 p.m. a man entered the Royal Bank on Main St. N. in Brampton and passed a note to the teller demanding money. The suspect became impatient with the teller and leaned over the counter and removed a small bundle of cash and fled.

Police report on Jan. 22 at 12:10 p.m. a man entered the TD Canada Trust in Woodchester Plaza in Mississauga and passed a note to the teller demanding money. Again he was given cash, and fled.

In all of the robberies a gun was indicated by the suspect, but was not seen.

Charged in connection with the incidents with five counts of robbery, and one count of disguise with intent to assault cause bodily harm is Mark King, 26, of Georgetown.

Also charged with two counts of robbery and one count of disguise with intent is Lisa Zawacki, 26, of Georgetown.

## Two charged in series of break-ins

Two people— one a corrections officer— are facing charges in connection with several break and enters into condos and apartments in Georgetown.

Halton Police report on Dec. 1 doors were pried open and jewelry, cash, identification and Second World War medals were taken from three condominiums in a building on McFarlane Dr. An attempt to enter a fourth condo was interrupted by the homeowner who described the culprits as a man and a woman.

Later that same day police say a couple gained entry into a Park Ave. apartment building by convincing a resident

to open the door for them.

Police say doors were pried open at two apartments there and jewelry and electronics were taken.

Charged with five counts of break and enter and commit theft and one count of break and enter with intent to commit an offence is Nicole Colleen Gienow, 27, a corrections officer at Metro West Detention Centre, of Owen Sound.

Charged with five counts of break and enter and commit theft, one count of break and enter with intent to commit theft and one count of possession of property obtained by crime is Tom Kabosos, 30, of Toronto.
