MISSING TEETH?

Even though you have done your best to look after your natural teeth, there eventually comes a time when you may need them extracted, for various different reasons. If this happens, the tooth or teeth should be replaced, not only to restore your smile, but to regain chewing and prevent other teeth from shifting. There are three main types of artificial teeth and each one is designed for a particular situation. They are dental implants, removable dentures and fixed bridges.

A dental implant is made by surgically placing one or more small metal posts beneath the gum into the jawbone and the artificial tooth or teeth attach to them.

A fixed bridge is a replacement that is cemented to the adjacent teeth and cannot be removed.

A removable denture replaces all of the lost teeth in the arch with one appliance. A partial denture is held in place by clasping some of the remaining teeth, and a full denture is held in place by suction or by sitting on the ridges

Today's hearing instruments have evolved from simple devices to remarkably sophisticated and technologically advanced personal hearing computers.
