On the junior side, 8-0 Christ the King will play its first-ever home playoff game on Wednesday against a yet-to-be determined opponent starting at 3:30 p.m.

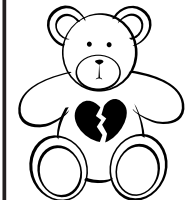
After failing to qualify though zone play-downs, the rink won Tankard Challenge
