Georgetown's juniors swept away Burlington's Notre Dame in two straight games to successfully defend their Halton crown. Led by co-captains Casey McFadyen and Grade 9 student Tory McCracken, the Rebels also placed third in the Sweet 16 tournament a couple of weeks ago, which featured some of the best teams in Ontario.

Two goals in a 12-second span early in the second period turned out to be enough for visiting Notre Dame to pull off yet another upset in the Halton girls' playoffs by eliminating the first-place Christ the King Jaguars 2-1 on Monday afternoon in the regional semifinals.

Finishing seventh in the Halton Tier I standings during the regular season with a 4-5-0 record, Notre Dame beat second-place Nelson last week in the quarterfinals and employed a defensive system that didn't allow Jaguar shooters many good opportunities to score.

Lauren Gilpin scored for CtK on a deflected point shot with just over four minutes left in the third period but the 6-0-4 Jaguars couldn't find an equalizer. A booming Brittany Westlake shot
