PAVEMENT MANAGEMENT

The Town of Halton Hills is proposing to resurface the following roadways under the 2007 Pavement Management Contract:

1. College Street – Ontario Street to John Street
2. John Street – C.N. Underpass to Victoria Street
3. Marilyn Crescent
4. Wesleyan
5. Market Street – Wesleyan to Mill Street
6. Prince Charles Drive (Rexway Drive to Delrex Drive)
7. Campbell Gate
8. Torino Gate
9. Alcott Drive
10. Gray Gate

The work on each section of roadway will vary but will generally include, asphalt removal/replacement, drainage improvements, curb and structure repairs and landscaping, as required.

The Pavement Management project is expected to begin in mid May with completion early this fall.
