MAPLE AVENUE (REGIONAL ROAD 11) RECONSTRUCTION FROM TRAFALGAR ROAD (REGIONAL ROAD 3) TO MOUNTAINVIEW ROAD, TOWN OF HALTON HILLS (GEORGETOWN)

Halton Region is planning for the two-lane road reconstruction of Maple Avenue (Regional Road 11) from Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) to Mountainview Road, in the Town of Halton Hills (Georgetown). Construction is scheduled to take place in 2007.

This project followed the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, which involved public consultations and the completion of an Environmental Study Report in March 2005. Why: Halton Region is seeking feedback from you on implementing the GreenCart program Region-wide.

Approximately 45% of the average garbage bag in Halton is made up of food scraps and other organic material that could be turned into compost. The proposed Region-wide implementation of the GreenCart program is an initiative to help achieve the 60% waste diversion goal outlined in Halton's 2006-2010 Solid Waste Management Strategy. This 60% diversion goal will assist in extending the life of our landfill.
