Protect yourself during immunization week

With this week being National Immunization Awareness Week, Halton Medical Officer of Health Dr. Bob Nosal is reminding residents that immunization is the best way to protect themselves against illnesses.

Nosal said immunization is one of the most effective methods of preventing the re-emergence of diseases like polio and controlling the spread of common illnesses such as the flu.

"Immunizations provided by family physicians, the Region's school-based clinics, long-term care home immunization programs and community immunization clinics have resulted in achieving high levels of protection," he said.

Halton's school-based clinics are an important part of delivering immunizations to school-aged children. Last year, public health nurses immunized

4,948 children against hepatitis B and 4,188 against meningococcal C.

The Region also said 93 per cent of children in local schools have had all age-appropriate immunizations. Halton has one of the highest rates of school-based immunization compliance in the province.

The health department is required to maintain immunization records for all daycare and school-aged children in Halton. Therefore, parents and caregivers need to remember to notify the health department each time their child is immunized.

It's also important that parents and caregivers keep their children's immunizations up-to-date and that they visit their healthcare professional on time to complete their series of vaccinations.

For example, the vaccine Prevnar

was introduced to protect children against pneumococcal disease and must be given at two, four, six and 15 months of age. Parents must also remember to add any immunization information to their child's yellow card.

To help increase local awareness about the importance of immunization, the Region will be distributing copies of two resources entitled 2006 Canadian Immunization Guide and Your Child's Best Shot to libraries in Halton Hills, Burlington, Oakville and Milton.
