What is The Sunpark Challenge?

The Sunpark Challenge is an initiative to build Canada's first solar energy park. It is set to be built April 2007 in Southwestern Ontario.

What is a solar park?

A solar park uses the sun's energy to generate electricity. Solar parks generate clean, renewable energy, do not harm our health, and emit no pollutants or greenhouse gases that can cause global warming.

What are solar cells?

Solar panels absorb sunlight and convert it into electricity. These panels are made up of 96 solar cells. On its own, a single cell will make a great contribution to the environment over its life span.

Who will benefit from this solar park?

Even though the solar park is in Southwestern Ontario, the electricity is sent directly to the Ontario power grid, meaning all residents of Ontario will benefit.

What are the details of the program?

When participating members install an air conditioning system, or perform five A/C maintenance visits, they will sponsor a solar cell at Sunpark.

Why did ClimateCare initiate this campaign?

Climate change affects us all. The future of our planet and the state of the environment is dependent on what we do today. At ClimateCare, they pride themselves on making indoor environments comfortable while keeping the outdoor environment protected.
