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
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Zellers donations mark birthday

Twenty years ago a young paraplegic completed wheeling around the world. His name is Rick Hansen and his accomplishment was nothing short of amazing.

His goal then, and today (as well as raising money for spinal cord research) is to bring awareness to the difficulties faced on a daily basis by people with physical disabilities.

On Sunday, June 10 the second annual Rick Hansen Wheels in Motion event will take place in Halton Hills at the Gellert Community Centre. The event is designed as a walk, run, wheel, bike or roller blade over a one kilometre or 10k loop in the park.

Forty per cent of all proceeds raised, will be used to fund a new "portable pool lift" to replace the aging equipment now in use at our community pools. Your support will help give a large number of disabled children "a lift" in our very active
