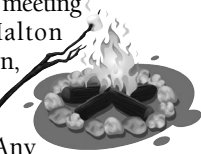

**CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT WINSTON CHURCHILL BOULEVARD
FROM 300 METRES NORTH OF BALLINAFAD ROAD / 32 SIDE ROAD
TO 1200 METRES SOUTH OF BALLINAFAD ROAD / 32 SIDE ROAD**

The Regional Municipality of Peel, along with County of Wellington, is carrying out a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study of Winston Churchill Boulevard from 1200 metres south of Ballinafad Road/32 Side Road to 300 metres north of Ballinafad Road/32 Side Road, including the intersection of Winston Churchill Boulevard and Ballinafad Road/32 Side Road in the Towns of Caledon, Halton Hills and Erin. The Study is required to address potential improvements to Winston Churchill Boulevard.

The study is being carried out in accordance with Schedule 7C of the Municipal Engineers Association (MEA) Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2000). Upon completion of the Study, an Environmental Study Report (ESR) will be filed and placed on public record. Notification regarding the completion and availability of the ESR will be provided at a later date.

At the first Public Information Centre (PIC) held in September 2006, the need and justification for the possible improvements to the existing corridor were presented, along with an evaluation of potential impacts on the natural and social environment. Based on the input and comments received to date, the study team has prepared alternative designs and will be presenting, for public review and comment, the preliminary preferred design.

Public consultation is vital to this Study. We want to ensure that anyone with an interest in this Study has the opportunity to get involved and provide input before a preferred design for the roadway improvements is selected and/or finalized.
