Business-government seminar set for June 7

The Region's Business Development Centre is offering to teach local companies how to do business with government through a seminar June 7.

The event is geared toward business owners in Halton who want to understand the procurement process at different levels of government.

Procurement representatives from the provincial and federal governments will discuss sourcing methods, bid solicitations, evaluation and selection criteria, recourse options and how to market to the government.

Specific government purchasing initiatives such as the procurement strategy for Aboriginal businesses and PS (Professional Services) On-line will also be introduced by the Office of Small and Medium Enterprises, Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC). A ques-

tion and answer period will follow.

A representative from Merx, the provider of electronic tendering services to the federal government, will give a live demonstration on how businesses can access millions of dollars of sales opportunities, find competitor intelligence and recognize government spending and public buying trends.

The seminar will run from 9 a.m. to noon in the Scotch Block/Merton Room at the Halton Regional Centre, 1151 Bronte Rd., Oakville. A continental breakfast will be provided. There's no registration fee, but pre-registration is required.


