Spencer has the scoring requirements to attend the U.S. Kids World Golf Championship at the famed Pinehurst Resort in North Carolina Aug. 2-4.

Elsewhere, Georgetown's Luke Ovenden was 15th with a 54-hole total of eight over par late last month at one of Canada's top tournaments for junior golfers as the RCGA CN Future Links Ontario Championship played out at the Peterborough Golf & Country Club.

Playing in the 19-and-under age group, the 16-year-old Ovenden shot 77-74-70 to finish just four shots out of the top six, which would have

secured an exemption into the Canadian Junior Boys' Championships Aug. 5-9 in Ile Bizard, Que.

Two other North Halton club members teed it up at the CN Future Links event, with Ryan Putnam placing 40th (78-77-77) at +19 and Ryan Thomson 42nd (76-80-77) at +20.

At the Golf Association of Ontario's Men's Match Play Championship at the Lake Joseph Club in Port Carling, Robbie Greenwell of Georgetown won his first four matches and advanced to the semifinals late yesterday (Thursday) afternoon.

The University of Memphis junior was seeded ninth out of the 64 qualifi-




