Region requests residents cut outdoor water use

The Region is asking residents to cut back on outdoor water use to alleviate pressure on Halton's reservoirs.

Although weather conditions can vary and rain has fallen, unseasonably dry weather this spring combined with heavy water use has prompted the Region to request that citizens minimize things like lawn watering, car washing and driveway washing. Flowers and vegetable gardens should be watered by hand and only as needed.

"The hot and dry weather in June has caused a spike in outdoor water use," said Regional Chair Gary Carr.

"We want to ensure that the Region's reservoirs have enough water to provide for essential household uses and fire protection,

so we're asking residents to help out by reducing their outdoor water use."

The Region's planning and public works staff is monitoring Halton's reservoir levels closely. If the hot, dry weather persists it may become necessary to issue a complete watering ban.

Halton has an odd-even day watering bylaw in effect that advises even-numbered houses should water only on even calendar days and odd-numbered houses should water on odd calendar days. However, since lawns only need one inch of water once a week to stay healthy, it's not necessary to water on every odd or even day.
