## Two hurt in Trafalgar Rd. crash

A 21-year-old Georgetown man remains in critical condition in Sunnybrook Hospital as a result of a multi-vehicle collision on Trafalgar Rd. Wednesday morning.

Police did not release the name of the man at the request of his family.

The accident, which occurred shortly after 7 a.m., was the second serious crash in Halton Hills in two days. On Tuesday morning David Forrester, 44, of Georgetown was killed in a head-on collision on Ninth Line. Police said he was attempting to pass a vehicle and collided with a southbound tractor-trailer (See story page 3).

Police say preliminary investigation revealed Wednesday's accident occurred when a northbound Nissan driven by the 21-year-old, crossed into the southbound

lane while attempting to pass another vehicle.

A tractor-trailer traveling southbound moved onto the shoulder to avoid a collision with the car. However, the car made contact with the tractor-trailer, causing the car to go out of control and collide head-on with a southbound pickup truck.

The driver of the pickup truck was taken to Georgetown Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the tractor-trailer was not injured.

Trafalgar Rd. between 10 and 15 Sideroad was closed for several hours.
