# Tumble Book Library allows kids to read online

Getting some kids to read can be tough. Getting some kids off the Internet can be even tougher. Consequently, getting kids to read books on the Internet should be a breeze!

And now you can do just that using a new feature of the Halton Hills Public Library's website, Tumble Book Library. Tumble Book Library is a fun and dynamic, online book resource where kids can view and listen to their favourite stories, some of which are read by the authors themselves.

The books are divided into three main sections: The Story Books section contains links to books you can read and/or listen to. The Life Learning section lists books for kids and their parents about important social and health issues such as being a volunteer or living with a nut allergy. Language learning contains books in French and Spanish. The games section includes

puzzles and memory games based on book themes. Each book or game includes a brief description, a grade-level recommendation, and a variety of features.

The features vary from book to book. Some books come with lesson plans and some come with a word helper feature designed to help beginning readers sound out unfamiliar words. Many also include a Tumble Quiz, a brief set of reading comprehen-

sion questions (complete with confetti and cheering when you get all the answers right).

There are even lift-the-flap books that let your youngster discover even more features on a single "page".

The website can be viewed in English, French or Spanish, which is a tremendous bonus if you are the parent of kids in French immersion. You can have the website display the books' descriptions in English, and then let the kids have the experience of the computer reading to them in French.

Also included on the website is an index of all the books available, listed by both title and author.

To access the Tumble Book Library, visit the library website at www.library.hhpl.on.ca, select "Kids" from the menu in the centre of the screen (dark blue background), click on Tumble Books, and let the fun begin!

New technology developed in the past several years can help most people with hearing loss to achieve improved communication. Today's hearing instruments have evolved from simple devices to remarkably sophisticated and technologically advanced personal hearing computers. In just the last few years, more advances in hearing aid technology have been made than throughout history.

In many hearing aids, there are no longer knobs or controls, because the instruments automatically adjust loudness. Some hearing aids are programmed so that they require only the push of a button either on the hearing aid or on a wireless remote control to switch to different listening situations and provide balanced sound in the office, at home, on the telephone, or at a concert. Digital and digitally programmable hearing aids have been introduced that amplify signals in new ways and make the benefits of hearing aids even more customized. Many hearing aids are virtually computers with flexible and sophisticated processors that analyze and respond to specific sounds. Some advanced hearing instruments process sound more than a million times per second.
