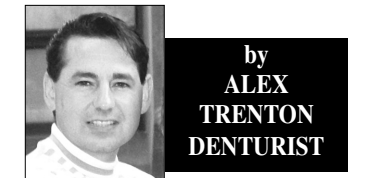

But in a survey of 1,023 men and women taken by the association, people put a much higher value on their teeth. Nearly one-fourth of the respondents said that they wouldn't sell a tooth for anything. About 15 percent said that they'd want a least \$1 million, but the rest were not so demanding and the average asking price from the entire group came out to \$309,00.00!

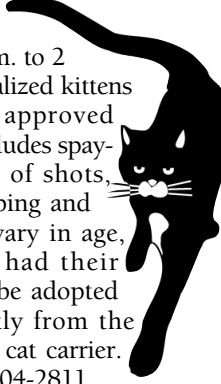
