

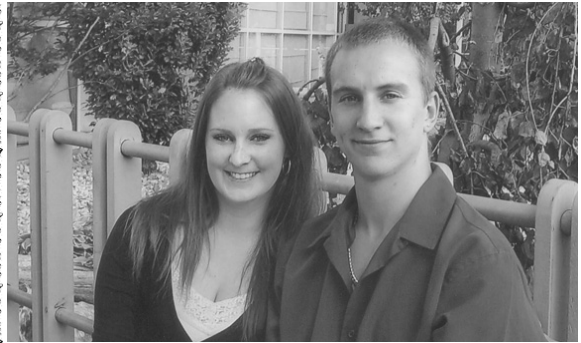

Thomson sixth at Jr. Invitational

The 16-year-old Thomson recorded rounds of 75-82-75-77 to finish a dozen shots behind the winner from Quebec. Players from Colombia also took part and Canadian players were invited to participate based on their rankings in the Royal Canadian Golf Association's CN Future Links Order of Merit this year.

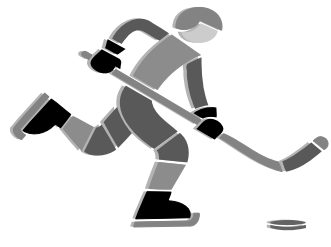
