Video photos lead to arrests

Halton Police received several phone calls after photos from video surveillance footage of three people believed to be using stolen credit cards in and around Halton were released by police and published by the media earlier this week.

The Independent & Free Press published the photos on Wednesday.

The credit cards were in a purse that was stolen from a vehicle parked in the lot at Mold-Masters SportsPlex on Dec. 29.

As a result of the calls received police have charged two people.

Charged with mischief under \$5,000, theft under \$5,000, possession of stolen property and three counts of breach of probation is Gary James Walker, 21, of Windgrove Dr., Innisfil.

Also charged is Tina Locey, 18, of Jay St. Brampton. Locey was charged with possession of stolen property and fraudulent use of a credit card.
