Students not penalized for tardiness

Board defends better late than never policy

Teachers across the province—including Halton District and Halton Catholic District School Board—no longer take marks off school students' assignments for lateness.

The policy is a directive from the Ministry of Education and is in place locally at Georgetown, Acton and Christ the King high schools.

Stuart Miller, Georgetown High School's new principal said, "there's a perception that

students can hand in assignments whenever they want and never get a zero," but he explained, "a zero can be given as a last resort."

He said teachers now have to go through a "pyramid of intervention" to work with students to hand their assignments in.


According to a letter on the policy sent to the community last week from the Halton District School Board, those steps could include helping students with time management skills, providing a calendar of critical dates for major assignments, breaking down major assignments into smaller stages throughout the semester,

communicating with parents about due dates and late assignments, getting to know the students so legitimate reasons for missed deadlines can be considered and giving detentions where students are required to work on the assignment.

Miller said once teachers have gone through that process and if the student still has not handed the work in, they can use "their professional judgment" and the student could be facing a zero.


