# Parking dispute leads to assault charge

A Georgetown man is facing an assault charge after a dispute over a parking spot at Georgetown Market Place Friday evening.

Police report the incident, in which one man grabbed another man and threw him against a vehicle several times breaking his glasses, occurred at about 6 p.m. The victim wasn't hurt, however, his glasses were broken.

Charged with assault is Michael Mari, 43, of Mountainview Rd. S.

The patron left, and police issued a warrant for his arrest.

The man went to the Georgetown Police station Monday.

## Police tell robbery victims 'don't be a hero'

"Don't be a hero" is the message Halton Police want to get out to employees and business owners who find themselves the victims of a robbery.

With the number of robberies in Halton Region recently, police recommend victims to follow some tips:

- Do not resist— You do not

know if the robber has a weapon. Obey the robber's instructions.

- Lock all the doors— Once the culprits have left. Don't touch any articles that may have been touched or left by the robbers.

- Call 911 immediately— Once the robbers have left the store, call police immediately and tell them the

name and exact location of your business. Stay calm.

- Write down the robber's description— In as much detail as possible, do not exaggerate height, weight, skin colour, sex, marks, scars, tattoos, clothing/colour, footwear, any detail that may help identify the robbers.
