Region urges Province to exempt municipalities from paying PST

The Region is asking the Province to give it, and all other Ontario municipalities, a tax break.

At its meeting last Wednesday, regional council passed a motion that calls on those at Queen's Park to fully exempt municipalities from paying PST, with the understanding that the savings would fund infrastructure requirements.

If the Province was to grant this wish, it would mean about \$2 million would be freed up in Halton's coffers each year.

Halton Hills Councillor Clark Somerville and Burlington councillors John Taylor and Peter Thoem all spoke out in favour of the motion.

"There's something absurd about one level of government levying tax on another," Thoem noted.

The Canadian government has already exempted all municipalities from paying GST.

The motion was put forward in support of a similar resolution recently passed by the City of Waterloo.

It will now be forwarded to both the provincial and federal governments, Association of Municipalities of Ontario, Federation of Canadian Municipalities and all Halton-area MPs and MPPs for consideration and appropriate action.
