Alpha for Youth program begins at local church on Saturday

Twens and teens will have a new opportunity to explore Christianity and the meaning of life at an upcoming Alpha for Youth program being offered by Union Presbyterian Church. It's a spin-off from the popular Alpha Course, which was first devised in London, England and has enjoyed global popularity.

Like the original Alpha course, Alpha for Youth is a practical exploration of the Christian faith, designed primarily for non-church goers and new Christians. The specially-designed youth curriculum focuses on presentations that are interactive and fast-paced.

Alpha for Youth is a bold new undertaking for the congregation of the Union Presbyterian Church, which will celebrate its 175th anniversary this spring and they invite all area youth in Grades 7 through high school to participate.

"This will be an exciting opportunity for our youth to explore Christianity and its meaning," says David Thompson, an elder at Union Presbyterian Church and the team leader for this new youth project.

The program begins Saturday, Feb. 23, at the church, 16789 22 Sideroad (corner of Winston Churchill Boulevard and Old School Road) and will run for 10 consecutive Saturdays, 9:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. Each session will begin with a family-style breakfast with discussion groups to follow.
