Pair sought in computer theft

Halton Police are looking for two men in connection with the theft of two ACER computers from Wal-Mart in Georgetown Market Place sometime between 1:25 and 3:30 p.m. Thursday.

Resident to get refund

The Town of Halton Hills will reimburse a Prince Charles Dr. man who wanted a refund on a minor variance application fee required to build a wheelchair ramp at the front of his home.

Bill Sanderson, who built the wheelchair ramp for his wife, called the fee unfair as it was built out of necessity for his wife's ingress and egress from the house, particularly in emergency situations.

While the fee is actually \$1,500, staff had reduced it to \$900.

"I built (it) out of necessity and it's for a handicapped person," Sanderson told councilors at a recent meeting, wondering if this was discrimination.

"I think this Town should be able to do something for handicapped people instead of charging them \$900 extra to build a wheelchair ramp," he said.

And council agreed, approving the reimbursement.

Director of Planning Bruce MacLean noted that staff is considering situations like this as the department develops the Town's new comprehensive zoning bylaw, and will be working towards a policy on this.
