

Jags looking to add to title collection

Christ the King's junior boys' hockey team will be shooting for its second straight All-Ontario Junior Classic starting today (Wednesday) at York University after earning yet another tourney title last week.

The junior Jaguars, who over the past three years have won six tournaments and earned consolation honours in two others, captured the Burlington Cup Invitational on Thursday after pounding Loyola 9-4 in the final.

Christ the King's roster features several players who are eligible for the upcoming Ontario Hockey League Priority Selection and has posted a 13-2 record this spring, includ-

ing the Wave Classic tourney title in Burlington.

Offensively, the Jags have been led by Burlington Cup MVP Michael Sgarbossa, Robbie Murden, J.P. Villeneuve, Nic Pierog and Luke Laidlaw, while defenders such as Steve Silas, Dale Deon, Bryan Slater and Ryan Brazzeau have played well in front of standout goalie Ryan Kelly.

At the Burlington Cup, CtK defeated M.M. Robinson 6-4, T.A. Blakelock 4-2 and Aldershot 7-1 in the preliminary round, before downing Nelson 6-4 in the quarterfinals and then Notre Dame 5-1 in the semis.

Event has raised \$658,000

Tee it up at annual Paul Murr tourney May 12

The 24th-annual Paul Murr Memorial Golf Tournament will take place Monday, May 12 at Acton's Blue Springs course and organizers hope to surpass last year's best-ever fund-raising total.

A \$62,000 donation was made to the Acton branch of the Canadian Cancer Society after the 2007 event, bringing the 23-year total raised by the tournament to \$658,000.

There are three different tournament packages to choose from for this year's tourney, which is expected to draw about 260 golfers.

The morning package (\$150) is a 7 a.m. shotgun scramble that includes 18 holes with power cart usage on the Turtle Lake championship course, lunch, driving range use, com-

plimentary afternoon play on the par-3 Trillium course, a buffet steak dinner and prizes.

The 1 p.m. shotgun scramble (\$175) includes 18 holes of Turtle Lake golf with power cart and driving range privileges, a buffet steak dinner and prize draws.

For the less-avid players, the Trillium package (\$100) from 1-4 p.m. consists of nine holes on the par-3 Trillium course, driving range usage, buffet steak dinner and prize draws.

Personal in-memoriams account for half of the tournament's revenue and can be made at the gold (\$500) and silver (\$150) levels.
