Halton Region

Halton residents have inherited a rich and diverse natural legacy that includes a wide range of plants and wildlife, unique features and areas of spectacular beauty, such as the Niagara Escarpment and Lake Ontario.

Halton Region has a number of key initiatives intended to preserve our environment. Halton is pleased to work in partnership with the Town of Halton Hills and the other Local Municipalities on these initiatives.

More Blue and Green for a Better Planet

Starting on April 7, 2008, Halton Region changed the way it provides waste management services to households:

- Weekly collection of GreenCart (collects kitchen scraps and compostable papers)
- Weekly collection of Blue Box (papers and containers can go in the same Blue Box)
- Collection of garbage every other week with a six bag/can limit (urban areas of Halton Hills only)

These changes will help protect the environment, extend the life of the landfill site, reduce greenhouse gas emissions improving air quality, and create useful recycling and compost products, for a better planet. To learn more, visit www.halton.ca. The first week of our new waste collection services has received outstanding support from our residents, thanks for your participation. Blue Box materials have increased by almost 30 per cent and approximately 75 per cent of residents are already participating in the GreenCart program. We want to thank you for your patience as we work out some of the delays residents may be experiencing through this transition period.



Halton Hills

Halton Hills recognizes the importance of making changes in our operations in order to help preserve and enhance our precious environment. We are always striving to improve and be more efficient. The efforts of Halton Hills and Halton Region to improve our environment are a complementary and effective partnership. Below is a short list of some of our environmental initiatives that have reinforced our long-standing commitment to environmental protection and enhancement.

Corporate Initiatives

- Our new Strategic Plan provides direction on matters related to sustainable design and energy efficiency; establishing a greenspace network; protecting the quality and quantity of ground and surface water; air quality improvements; and energy conservation.
- In December 2007, Town of Halton Hills Council endorsed (in principle) a *Green Plan* developed by the Mayor's Green Plan Task Force to act as a guide in developing and implementing "green" strategies and actions. It focuses on actions that are "PAREE" or Practical, Affordable, Reasonable, Enforceable and Educational.
- Recognizing the need to "think globally and act locally" we participated in the global Earth Hour event. Non-essential lights were turned off at all Town facilities on Saturday March 29 without jeopardizing public safety and security, and without interrupting regular service. The Town, its residents, businesses and organizations collaborated to make Earth Hour a success as demonstrated by the 9.4% reduction in energy use.



Planning for a Healthy Environment

- The Town's new Official Plan establishes an 'environment-first' philosophy to protect our many significant environmental features and also includes comprehensive Environmental Management Policies.
- The Town is currently preparing Community Improvement Plan and Intensification Opportunities studies to make efficient use of infrastructure, and to establish healthy and vibrant communities.

Public Works Environmental Initiatives

- Between 2006 and 2007, the Town has recycled approximately 13,000 tonnes of asphalt.
- Halton Hills continues to add stormwater treatment structures into its designs to reduce pollutants entering the Town's watercourses.
- Halton Hills has reduced energy use through the conversion of traffic signals to LED technology which uses 85 per cent less electricity compared to conventional signal bulbs.

Providing Green Library Services

- The Halton Hills Library Services computer system for its Internet workstations and computer catalogues has one computer running as many as ten workstations. In addition, the library has reduced its lighting use during longer daylight hours.

- The 4th Annual Halton Hills 20 Minute Makeover is scheduled for Friday, April 18. Everyone is encouraged to participate by picking up litter in their immediate neighbourhoods.
- The 8th annual Community Wide Clean Up Day is on Saturday, April 19. Hundreds of volunteers will scour our parks, ravines and roadsides to collect litter. The rain date is Saturday, April 26.
- Earth Day Celebrations in Halton Hills will take place Saturday, April 26 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., at the Town's Robert C. Austin Public Works Yard.
