South Pacific opens at the John Elliott Theatre on May 1 and runs until May 10 (seven shows). It is suitable for all ages and Globe has added a matinee on May 4 for those who prefer a day-time show.

This famous Rodgers and Hammerstein musical is set in the Second World War and follows the lives of the American marines and nurses who are stationed in the South Pacific.

The show is full of funny numbers like *There is Nothing Like a Dame*, *I'm Gonna Wash That Man Right Outa My Hair* and *Honey Bun*. The crazy antics of the sailors are contrasted by the romantic numbers *Some Enchanted Evening* and

Younger Than Springtime. The audience is sure to shed tears of laughter but also be very touched by the heroism in the story.

The cast is an experienced group. Mark Llewellyn (recently Coalhouse Porter in *Ragtime*) is tackling the role of romantic plantation owner Emile Dubec for the second time.



- Complete removal of existing concrete bridge deck
- Remove existing railings
- Remove/replace expansion joints
- Construction of a new concrete bridge deck
- Construction of new parapet walls with railings
- Construction of an approach slab
- Rehabilitate existing structural steel beams

HERE'S SOME CHANGE FOR THE BUS.

STARTING SATURDAY, APRIL 26, 2008, THERE WILL BE CHANGES
 TO GEORGETOWN GO BUS SERVICE.

A new weekday westbound trip will depart Union Station GO Bus Terminal at 7:45 p.m., run express to Steeles Ave. and Rutherford Rd., make various stops in Brampton, and arrive at Georgetown GO Station at 8:56 p.m. A new weekday westbound trip will depart Union Station GO Bus Terminal at 1:30 a.m., run express to Malton GO Station, make various stops in Brampton, and arrive at Georgetown GO Station at 2:56 a.m. Several existing weekday westbound evening bus trips have been extended to serve Georgetown.

There will be many changes to existing weekday westbound trips including earlier departures and platform changes at Union Station GO Bus Terminal, so be sure to check the new schedule and trip departure boards.

Friday and Sunday trips to the University of Guelph will be discontinued for the spring and summer due to typically lower ridership during this time.
