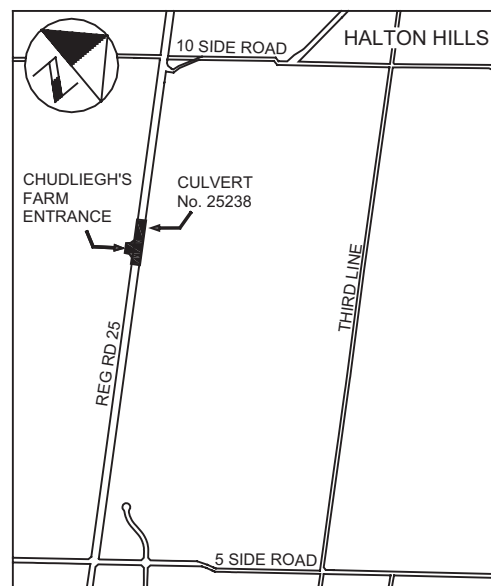

Road may see improvement if building is demolished

Kanichis said they have included two-to-three feet of stone around the building and that it's a "nice, clean-looking building."

He indicated they were open to discussion about what it might look like, "as long as it looks still like a store and not a house."

After the Carpet Palace owners submitted their plans for their property to the Town, Bob Butrym, the Town's traffic manager, said in response to concerns raised by Norval residents over the years about traffic at the intersection of Adamson St. and Hwy. 7. the possibility of taking some property from the Carpet Palace land to improve that intersection is being considered.

He said with the old building removed a left-turn lane could possibly be added for northbound Adamson St. traffic south of Hwy. 7, but it is only an option to be considered by the Regions of Peel and Halton.

That potential road improvement is troubling to Reed who said if that happens, "there will be no Norval bypass" because there will be no pressure to build one.

"It's further deterioration of the whole character of the community," said Gastle,

Both she and Reed are upset Heritage Halton Hills has no issue with the building's demolition.

The Carpet Palace owners require a minor variance, site plan approval a demolition permit and building permit before they can go forward with their plans for the property.

The application is to be before the Town's Committee of Adjustment Wednesday, May 7.

"There's a process to be followed," said Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette. "I'm sure the former mayor would know this. It's early in the process. It's just in the circulation stage. No decision has been made."
