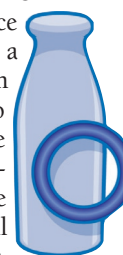

CAST IRON WATERMAIN REPLACEMENT AND SANITARY SEWER REHABILITATION/REPLACEMENT AND ROAD REHABILITATION AND STORM SEWER IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CHURCH STREET AREA, TOWN OF HALTON HILLS (ACTON) PR-2511



Halton Region is proposing cast iron watermain replacements on the following streets:

- Church Street East from Main Street to Eastern Avenue
- Church Street West from Main Street to 136 metres west of Main Street
- Mill Street West from Park Avenue to Main Street

In conjunction with the watermain replacements, sanitary sewers will also be rehabilitated/replaced on the following streets:

- Church Street East from Main Street to Eastern Avenue
- Church Street West from Main Street to 136 metres west of Main Street
- Church Street West from 136 metres west of Main Street to Victoria Avenue
- Willow Street from Mill Street to Church Street
- Mill Street West from Main Street to Victoria Street

The Town of Halton Hills is also proposing road and storm sewer rehabilitation along with curb and sidewalk repair/replacement on the following streets:

- Church Street West from Victoria Avenue to Main Street
- Church Street East from Main Street to Eastern Avenue
- Mill Street West from Victoria Avenue to Main Street
- Willow Street from Mill Street to Church Street East

A joint Public Information Centre will be held to provide resident with an opportunity to review the project drawings and to discuss any potential construction disruptions that may result from the proposed works. Representatives from Halton Region and the Town of Halton Hills will be in attendance to answer any questions. The Public Information Centre is scheduled for:
