Church anniversary: Churchill Community Church's 170th anniversary will

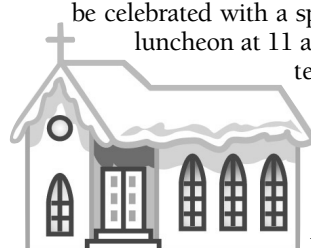
