Grateful resident donates \$100K to hospital

The donation will be used to purchase medical equipment for the hospital,

"We need everything from basic equipment like beds, to leading edge surgical equipment and lifesaving emergency equipment like defibrillators and ventilators," added Carruthers.

"We are hoping to raise \$600,000 for new hos-

pital equipment this year and, thanks to Mr. Badham's generous donation, we are well on our way to achieving that goal."

"Georgetown Hospital has a wonderful reputation and personal donations such as this are a testament to the great care our hospital provides to our community. I hope that Mr. Badham's commitment to his hospital and community will inspire others to consider the ongoing equipment needs not funded by the Ministry of Health," said Paul Armstrong, Chair of the Georgetown Hospital Foundation.

"We thank Mr. Badham for remembering our hospital. His gift will make a phenomenal difference to our patients and their families."
