She added that the nature of Matt's cardiac disease is genetic and that family members will have to be tested every year for the condition, and even then ARVD is difficult to detect.

"People just assume that heart disease is an older person's disease but it doesn't

distinguish between young and old."

The Heart & Stroke Foundation approached the Barkers about doing media interviews to help publicize this Sunday's ride and advertisements bearing Matt's photo ran recently in *The Globe & Mail* as well as *The Independent & Free Press*.

Custom-designed t-shirts with Matt's

picture and the team logo are being sold, with \$2 from each purchase going to the Heart & Stroke Foundation.

Christ the King and Matt's former elementary school, St. Brigid of Georgetown South, have events planned this week to collect sponsorship as well, and Motoring For Matt has hovered amongst the top-10 group fundraising totals for the ride.

There is a web page connected to the www.rideforheart.ca. site that is dedicated to the team.


"The donations from the community have been great and another thing that's important to us is that Matt's face is out there and that his memory will live on because of this," said James.

NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT RAIL SERVICE EXPANSION FROM GEORGETOWN TO KITCHENER

THE STUDY:

GO Transit, the Province of Ontario's interregional public transit service for the Greater Toronto and Hamilton areas, is undertaking a Preliminary Design Study and Class Environmental Assessment to expand rail services from Georgetown to Kitchener. The Study will review potential sites for the construction of new rail stations and layover facilities, and will also identify potential improvements to the existing rail line between Georgetown and Kitchener.



THE PROCESS:

The project will follow the planning process for a "Group B" project as outlined in the GO Transit – Class Environmental Assessment (2005) with the opportunity for public involvement throughout. Consultation will take place throughout the study with Municipalities, external agencies, and Public Information Centres.

An Environmental Study Report (ESR) documenting the preliminary design work, anticipated environmental effects of the project and commitments to mitigation measures will be filed for public and agency review at the completion of the study. Notices of viewing locations will be published at that time.
