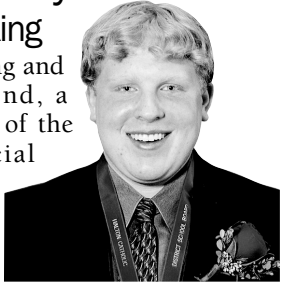
... and Sharing the Spirit

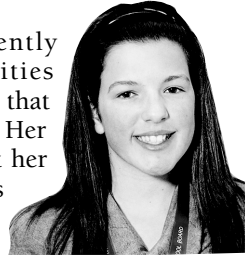
Maeve Sharkey

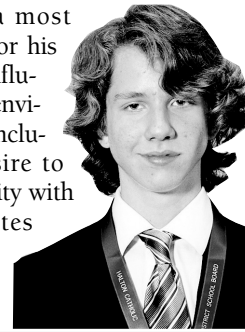
Sandra Frias
