NOTICE OF INTENT AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR PUBLIC INPUT

LANDSCAPING BUSINESSES, NURSERIES AND SIMILAR USES IN THE RURAL AREAS OF THE REGION OF HALTON AND IN THE NORTH ALDERSHOT AREA OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON

1. Notice of Intent/Background

The Region of Halton and its local municipalities including the City of Burlington, Town of Halton Hills and Town of Milton are undertaking a review of land use policies and regulations for landscaping businesses, nurseries and similar uses in the rural area of the Region, as well as the North Aldershot area of the City of Burlington. The purpose of this project is to consult with the public and landscaping industry; review current provincial, regional and local land use policies; document the characteristics of these land uses; assess the appropriateness of these uses in a rural setting and North Aldershot, and provide a recommendation to Region of Halton Council.

The study will address important questions such as:

- How are these land uses defined/classified?
- What are the visual and other characteristics of these land uses?
- Where should these types of land uses be permitted?
- What policies, regulations and municipal approval process should apply?

2. Public Input

Public input is a key component of the study and opportunities to participate will be provided as the study progresses. Information will be posted on the Region of Halton website (www.halton.ca) as it becomes available. Members of the public who wish to participate in this study and require notification of public meetings or other matters related to the study should contact Mr. Stirling Todd, Senior Planner as noted below. Written submissions are welcome at any time and should also be directed to the study contact noted below.

In addition to the opportunities for public input provided as part of this study, any corresponding amendments to the Region of Halton Official Plan and/or the Official Plans of the local municipalities that may result from this study will be subject to the statutory notification and public hearing requirements of the Planning Act.
