Eight arrested in crime sweep

A recent property crime sweep by Halton Regional Police in Georgetown recovered more than \$6,000 in stolen goods and resulted in eight Halton Hills residents facing charges.

The Halton Police Division 11 Property Team conducted street-level investigations over the past two months in the community after a rash of break-ins and thefts.

Among the recovered property was a car, computers, home electronics equipment and prescription drugs.

Four adults and four young offenders have been charged with numerous property-related offences, breach of court orders and drug offences. Investigators laid a total of 28 charges.

No names were released by police.
