Urban Yard Waste Collection

Only use paper yard waste bags or open, reusable, rigid containers labelled as yard waste. If using a reusable, rigid container, you can drill holes on the bottom of the yard waste container for drainage.
Do not use cardboard boxes.

Yard waste labels for reusable containers are available at no charge from Halton Region. Call Halton Region between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday at 905-825-6000, 1-866-4HALTON (1-866-442-5866) or TTY 905-827-9833.

Containers may have a capacity up to 125 L (27 imperial gallons) and weigh no more than 23 kg (50 lbs).

Yard waste in cardboard boxes, Blue Boxes, GreenCarts or plastic bags will not be collected.

Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than 1.2 m (4 ft) by 0.6 m (2 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm (3 inches) in diameter.

In Collection Areas 3, 4, and 5, yard waste is collected every other week, on the same day as your garbage. In Collection Areas 1 and 2, there is no yard waste collection.

Acceptable materials:



- Leaves
- Sticks & Twigs
- Tree trimmings
- Decorative cornstalks
- Pumpkins
- Fallen fruit from trees
- Yard and garden trimmings

Not Accepted:



- Grass clippings
- Tree stumps
- Sod, soil, and rocks
- Clay
- Plastic shopping or garbage bags
- Plastic flower/plant pots
- Flower/plant markers and tags

Grasscycling

Grass clippings are not accepted with yard waste for collection. Instead, grasscycle! After mowing, leave grass clippings on your lawn. Grass clippings are approximately 80 per cent water and will decompose quickly, releasing valuable nutrients back into the soil. Grasscycling is an environmentally and financially friendly option for your lawn care.

Thank you Halton residents!

Thank you to all Halton residents for making the new GreenCart program such a success! Support for this new program has been tremendous—it is exciting to see so many GreenCarts at the curb every week.

In the first month of the new waste programs, approximately 62 per cent of curbside waste was diverted away from our landfill. During that time, your efforts reduced what had been going into our landfill by 20 per cent. These initial numbers are very encouraging and I hope you will continue to reduce, reuse and recycle when possible.

Thank you for all of your efforts. Together, we can reach the goal of diverting 60 per cent of our annual residential waste away from our landfill site.

Game two here Saturday in 'Dogs-Gaels matchup

If the Halton Hills Bulldogs want to improve on last year's best-ever post-season showing, they'll have to knock off the team that stopped their fine 2007 playoff run.

The Bulldogs will be in Bowmanville tonight (Friday) to take on the Green Gaels of Clarington in the opening match of their best-of-5 Ontario Lacrosse Association East Conference semifinal series. Game two is set for Georgetown's Alcott Arena Saturday at 7:30 p.m.

Second-place Clarington, 17-3-0 on the season, defeated Barrie 3-1 in their quarterfinal series, while the 15-5-0 Bulldogs are well-rested after taking out Newmarket in three straight games. The Gaels won the only regular season encounter between the two clubs, 11-10 on May 8.

The Bulldogs may have caught a bit of a break as one of Clarington's top players, Mark Cockerton, is playing for Canada at the under-19 field lacrosse championships and will miss the first two games of the series.

"They're the reigning champs for our conference and no matter who they've got in there, we'll have to be

It was the farthest that the Halton Hills franchise has progressed in the playoffs. Clarington went on to lose to the eventual Founders' Cup champion Six Nations Rebels.

The 2008 Founders' Cup national Jr. B championship tournament will take place in Guelph in late August.
