Urgent need for cat food



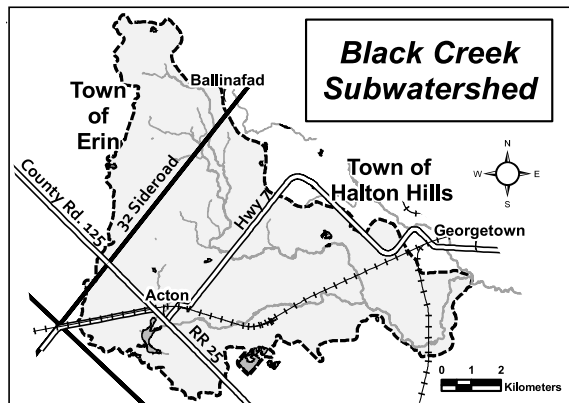
Upper Credit Humane Society (UCHS) is desperately seeking donations of canned cat food to help feed the masses of cats that are at the Shelter during this period.

Black Creek Subwatershed Study Community Focus Group

Credit Valley Conservation, in partnership with the Region of Halton, Town of Halton Hills and Town of Erin, is conducting an environmental study to understand the health of the Black Creek Subwatershed. We invite interested community members within the study area to take part in the Black Creek Subwatershed Study Focus Group.



Understanding the Black Creek Subwatershed Ecosystem

In the year ahead, we will be conducting field investigations looking at water quality, fisheries, benthics, stream flows, groundwater, wetlands, forests, plants, birds and amphibians. The findings of these studies will be combined with background information to update and expand our understanding of the Black Creek Subwatershed and to

determine the measures required to protect the subwatershed into the future.

If you have concerns about the environmental conditions within the study area, or are interested in how the subwatershed will be managed you may want to join the Focus Group to provide advice and ideas.

Our first Focus Group meeting is anticipated to take place September 2008. The deadline to apply to join is **Friday, August 29th, 2008.**

Established in 2007 the CTC Source Protection Committee represents the general public, municipal, business and interest group sectors across the Credit Valley, Toronto and Region and Central Lake Ontario Source Protection Areas. The Committee is charged with guiding the source protection planning process over the next four years. Further information can be found at www.ctcswp.ca.

The CTC Source Protection Committee (SPC) has completed the first drafts of its Terms of Reference. The documents are now available for public review and comment period which ends September 21, 2008. Under the Clean Water Act, 2006, the public has the opportunity to review and provide comment. In revising the draft documents the SPC will consider any comments received in writing prior to 4:30 p.m. September 21, 2008.

Draft Terms of Reference have been prepared for each of the three source protection areas in the CTC Source Protection Region. Copies of these documents are available at member Conservation Authority offices, municipal offices and are also posted online at www.ctcswp.ca.

Seven public meetings have been scheduled in September to give everyone an opportunity to review the documents and get more information.
