#### TOWN PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE & FACILITATED WORKSHOP

On Monday, September 8, 2008, the Town of Halton Hills will be holding a Public Information Centre and Facilitated Workshop at the Gellert Community Centre on the five Growth Concepts recently released by the Region of Halton as part of the Region's Sustainable Halton exercise. This Town Workshop is separate from the Region's Public Information Centre on September 16th, 2008.

The Region of Halton is requesting comments from the Town on the five Growth Concepts in general and more specifically in the context of seven questions by the end of September in order to establish a short list of two or three growth options for further consideration. The Town Public Information Centre and Facilitated Workshop is being held to obtain public input and assist Council in developing a response on the Growth Concepts.

More detail on the Region's Sustainable Halton Exercise and the Town's consideration of it is set out in a Discussion Paper prepared by the Town and available from the Town's Planning, Development and Sustainability Department at the Civic Centre or on the Town's Website, [www.haltonhills.ca](http://www.haltonhills.ca), or at the Town's Library Branches in Acton and Georgetown.
