## Golf roundup Salisbury wins event

Adam Salisbury of Georgetown fired a one-over-par 73 to win the boys' 17-19 age group at the Canadian Junior Golf Association's Kaneff Series event held recently at the Carlisle Golf & Country Club.

Salisbury, 17, was seven strokes better than the runner-up.

At the CJGA's Junior Linkster Tour stop at the Annandale Golf & Country Club, Nicklaus Naumovski of Halton Hills finished in a tie for second spot with a six-over-par round of 80, nine shots off the lead in the boys' 8 & under division.

Callum Biehn of Georgetown placed 12th in the boys' 11-12 age category at Annandale with rounds of 91-104.

Georgetown's Mary Ann Lapointe tuned up for this weekend's USGA Women's Mid-Amateur Championships in Michigan by finishing tied for third with partner Aron Burch of Hamilton at the Golf Association of Ontario's Mixed Team Championship at the Wooden Sticks Golf Club on Monday.

Lapointe and Burch combined for a 70, three shots behind the winners.

Eagle Ridge Golf Club members Pamela Piotrowski and Bryan Francis placed seventh while North Halton members Robert and Donna Davey of Georgetown finished tied for 23rd.

Samantha Spencer of Georgetown South recorded a round of 82 to win the girls' division by two shots at the GAO Bantam Tour tourney played at the National Pines Golf Club in Barrie.

The 12-year-old North Halton member was chosen to play for the GAO Team at the Ontario Junior Tour Championships, tying for 11th in the open girls' category with an 86. Georgetown's Candice Swartz, 16, tied for fifth after an 80.

Spencer also made the 36-hole cut at the CJGA Mizuno National Championships at National Pines, placing 12th thanks to rounds of 87-88-94-91.



## Raiders look to put poor pre-season behind them

After posting a sub-.500 pre-season record, the 2008-09 edition of the Georgetown Raiders should find out fairly quickly where they stand at the start of the OHA Provincial Jr. A Hockey League campaign.

The Raiders will begin their regular season on Saturday night at the Alcott Arena beginning at 7:30 p.m. against the Huntsville Otters, who have a dozen players back from their team that finished first in the North Conference last year.

Georgetown, which had a 2-3 record in the exhibition schedule, including a pair of losses to the Orangerville Crushers last week, also has several returnees off the 2007-08 roster that made it to the West Conference finals.

But Raider head coach and general manager James Richmond is somewhat concerned about some of his club's goals-against totals in the pre-season and is hopeful the team can raise its level of play against the Otters, who are stocked with prospects with the Ontario Hockey League's Erie Otters.

"I don't like to play anything and lose and we had a losing record in the pre-season," said the third-year bench boss.

"We're not killing ourselves about it, but we're concerned, especially because Huntsville's going to be a tough team for anybody to beat. We need some of the guys who had big years last year to get things rolling for everyone else as we bring in some new faces and get used to playing together."

Georgetown was supposed to begin its regular season tonight (Friday) in Brampton against the Bramalea Blues, but the Powerade Centre is being used for the best-of-7 Mann Cup lacrosse championship between the host Excelsiors and the New Westminster Salmonbellies.
