Raiders open season Saturday against Otters

The game has been rescheduled to Tuesday, Sept. 16.

Back for a second season with the Raiders is 20-year-old forward Marcus Pryde of Oakville, who had been in Alberta skating with a Tier II Jr. A team, but decided to return home for his final season of junior. The 6-foot-1, 180-pound Pryde led the Raiders in scoring during the 2008 playoffs with 11 points in 10 games.

Also signed this week was winger Aaron Pearce from Mississauga, a second-round draft pick of the OHL's Peterborough Petes in May. Sixteen-year-old Pearce played for the Toronto Marlboro minor midgets last season and checks in at 5-foot-10, 180 pounds.

Richmond is negotiating with the Kingston Voyageurs for the rights to 20-year-old sniper Andrew Marcoux of nearby Rockwood, who had 30 goals and 58 points last season. The 5-foot-10, 180-pound forward practised with the Raiders Wednesday and could be in the lineup Saturday against Huntsville.

"I think we're going to be good. It's just a matter of how good this team can be," added Richmond.

"We may be making changes to the team as players become available from other places, but we'll have a full lineup Saturday night and I know everyone's excited about getting things going."

Another newcomer is 16-year-old winger Ashton Anderson of Brampton, a 6-foot-2, 175-pound draft pick of the OHL's Owen Sound Attack, to fill the league limit of two 1992-born players per team.

A second goaltender will likely be signed prior to the home opener and it's expected third-year Jr. A vet Vince Cusick will get the start against Huntsville.

The Raiders will no longer be vying for the OPJAHL West Division title as the conferences have been renamed, meaning that Georgetown will play in the MacKinnon Division, saluting Bob MacKinnon, who was OHA Chairman from 1984-86. New teams in the division include the Vaughan Vipers and the reborn Bramalea Blues, while the Hamilton Red Wings have switched to the Central Division.

For Saturday's home opener, the first 250 spectators entering the arena will receive a gift compliments of Grand & Toy.

In other league news, Georgetown's Craig Rylett has signed with the Cobourg Cougars in the newly formed OPJAHL Central Division after a good showing in goal at the training camp of the OHL's Sudbury Wolves. A ninth-round draft pick of the Wolves, Rylett, who turns 17 on Saturday, is considered third on Sudbury's depth chart by head coach Mike Foligno.
