## Committee of Adjustment members to get pay increase

Halton Hills council has approved a yearly pay raise for Committee of Adjustment members.

The four members receive an honorarium of \$80 per meeting and \$100 for the chair. The appointed members of the community, who make decisions on minor variances etc, have not received a raise since 2005.

The committee will get a cost-of-living pay increase, which is 3 per cent.

The pay increase is retroactive to January 2008, and will up budget costs by \$151.20.


