

Three residents injured in two-car Erin crash

Three Halton Hills residents were injured, one critically, in an accident in Erin Saturday afternoon.

Wellington OPP report the accident occurred at about 1:50 p.m. on Wellington Rd. 124 (Hwy. 24) near 10 Sideroad when a 2000 Volvo traveling southbound skidded across the road into the northbound lanes where it struck a northbound 2006 Chevrolet Cobalt.

The driver of the Cobalt, Tanya Burton, 36 of Georgetown and her eight-year-old son received non-life threatening injuries in the crash and were taken to Georgetown Hospital for treatment.

The driver of the Volvo, Cynthia Jolie, 43, of Limehouse and her passenger, a 48-year-old Mississauga man, were rushed by air ambulance to Hamilton General Hospital, where they both remain in critical but stable condition.

Traffic was re-routed for five hours while OPP officers worked to reconstruct the events of the accident.
